

Greetings in the name of Christ!

The above quote by New Testament scholar N.T. Wright invites us to consider the hope in our Lenten journey. It will not surprise you that I appreciate both the inspiration and the practical suggestions of his reflections. Lent is a season of reflection with an opportunity to prepare our lives to move deeper into our relationship with God through Christ. Let's break it down a bit:

- Lent is a time for discipline. Recall that the word "discipline" is rooted in the idea of teaching. What teaching can we engage in as we move toward the cross? Is there a meditation app that has intrigued you--try it! Is there a book that you have been wanting to read--a chapter a day works. Beginning the habit of taking a walk, writing in a journal or simply breathing to refocus remind us that we are worth the time and effort.
- Lent is a time for confession. Confession is good for the soul. It does
 indeed cleanse us of all unrighteousness and it helps us sleep better too!
 Reviewing our day and letting go of the things we have done, or said, or
 left undone as a practice will allow us to begin again. God doesn't find
 fault, as forgiveness and grace are always present when we seek to
 mend our relationships.
- Lent is a time for honesty. We need to be honest about our journey of faith. Are we willing to surrender our control so that we might be responsive to the Spirit? What is holding us back from loving ourselves

fully as children of God? What will invite us to be authentic and honest about our lives?

God has good things in store for us. Lent reminds us that we are called to look for them and to express gratitude for the blessings of our lives. God wants us to deepen our love for God and each other. Let us dare to make this Lent a time for preparation and joy!
